Facts to 9×9 - work the steps from left to right, then write the answer.

How it works: Break a Factor Apart Split one factor into two easy pieces, multiply each piece, then add.

$6 \times 7 = \underline{42}$

first 5 groups of 6

$5 \times 6 = \underline{30}$

then 2 more groups

$2 \times 6 = \underline{12}$

add the two parts

$\underline{30} + \underline{12} = \underline{42}$

1) $7 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$

first 5 groups of 5

$5 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$

then 2 more groups

$2 \times 5 = \underline{\quad}$

add the two parts

$\underline{\quad} + \underline{10} = \underline{\quad}$

first 5 groups of 7

6) $8 \times 7 = \underline{\quad}$

first 5 groups of 7

$5 \times 7 = \underline{\quad}$

then 3 more groups

$3 \times 7 = \underline{\quad}$

add the two parts

$\underline{\quad} + \underline{21} = \underline{\quad}$

7) $6 \times 8 = \underline{\quad}$

first 5 groups of 6

$5 \times 6 = \underline{\quad}$

then 3 more groups

$3 \times 6 = \underline{\quad}$

add the two parts

8) $4 \times 8 = \underline{\quad}$

first 5 groups of 4

then 3 more groups

$$6 \times 7 = \underline{42}$$

first 5 groups of 6

$$5 \times 6 = \underline{30}$$

then 2 more groups

$$2 \times 6 = \underline{12}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{30} + \underline{12} = \underline{42}$$

1) $7 \times 5 = \underline{35}$

first 5 groups of 5

$$5 \times 5 = \underline{25}$$

then 2 more groups

$$2 \times 5 = \underline{10}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{25} + \underline{10} = \underline{35}$$

2) $7 \times 7 = \underline{49}$

first 5 groups of 7

$$5 \times 7 = \underline{35}$$

then 2 more groups

$$2 \times 7 = \underline{14}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{35} + \underline{14} = \underline{49}$$

3) $7 \times 3 = \underline{21}$

first 5 groups of 3

$$5 \times 3 = \underline{15}$$

then 2 more groups

$$2 \times 3 = \underline{6}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{15} + \underline{6} = \underline{21}$$

4) $7 \times 4 = \underline{28}$

first 5 groups of 4

$$5 \times 4 = \underline{20}$$

then 2 more groups

$$2 \times 4 = \underline{8}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{20} + \underline{8} = \underline{28}$$

5) $4 \times 6 = \underline{24}$

first 5 groups of 4

$$5 \times 4 = \underline{20}$$

then 1 more groups

$$1 \times 4 = \underline{4}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{20} + \underline{4} = \underline{24}$$

6) $8 \times 7 = \underline{56}$

first 5 groups of 7

$$5 \times 7 = \underline{35}$$

then 3 more groups

$$3 \times 7 = \underline{21}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{35} + \underline{21} = \underline{56}$$

7) $6 \times 8 = \underline{48}$

first 5 groups of 6

$$5 \times 6 = \underline{30}$$

then 3 more groups

$$3 \times 6 = \underline{18}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{30} + \underline{18} = \underline{48}$$

8) $4 \times 8 = \underline{32}$

first 5 groups of 4

$$5 \times 4 = \underline{20}$$

then 3 more groups

$$3 \times 4 = \underline{12}$$

add the two parts

$$\underline{20} + \underline{12} = \underline{32}$$
